QUESTIONS

- Read Job 42:2. How does it feel knowing that God can do anything?
- How would you feel if you were in Job's shoes?
- What does it mean to you to have faith in something?
- Name one blessing in your own life.

ACTIVITY

Have a box filled with various items (e.g., game pieces, construction paper, glue, markers, toys, candy, etc.). Choose a scenario listed below and have the kids try and solve it by using the materials in the box. Encourage the kids to be creative!
